Participants must take a taxi (at a cost of \$35-\$50) or the Blue line L train (at a cost of \$5, get off at Clinton) to the Greyhound Bus Station in Chicago, Illinois.

Our housing is located within walking distance of down town Jacksonport, and is a short bike ride from many beaches and one of Door County's five state parks. Students will have ample time to explore all that makes Door County great: the beaches, food sense, the art culture and the natural beauty of the county. Their lodging resides in the heart of Door County which is fast becoming a top tourist destination in the United States. Door County boasts a whopping 300 miles of shoreline so you can watch a sunrise and a sunset over the water without traveling more than 10 miles, or enjoy a plethora of water sports. The county is home to thousands of acres of orchards which in turn has created a bountiful farm market culture. There is also a rich arts scene with play houses, galleries, and theaters throughout the entire county. Door County is also known for its rich wine and beer cultures. Not to mention Door County is home to five state parks and 11 historic lighthouses.

Indicate other nearby activities:

Sturgeon Bay has exceptional visual beauty and tourists have been coming to the town and the surrounding area since the early 1900's. The town has the most accessible shoreline of all the Door County communities so participants will easily be able to go swimming, jet skiing, kayaking, boating or paddle boarding. Almost everything in the town is within walking distance and there are many charming shops and galleries set in century-old barns. Participants whose employment is terminated (involuntarily or voluntarily) have 2 weeks from the last day of work to find a new job and to submit a valid and complete Self-Arranged Job Offer (SAJO) to Greenheart Exchange for consideration. If the participant fails to submit a SAJO within the 2 week deadline, Greenheart Exchange will shorten the participant's program.

If Greenheart Exchange rejects the SAJO, the participant has one (1) business day to resubmit a new or a revised SAJO, based on the directions received from Greenheart Exchange. Information about prohibited jobs for SWT program participants can be found at https://greenheartexchange.org/host/host-hire-seasonal-staff/#/tab/regulations.

If the participant no longer has housing, the participant must look for permanent housing immediately, and within two weeks must secure permanent housing that complies with Greenheart Exchange's Housing Guidelines.
