As a server, participants will be taking customers' orders, serving food and beverages, preparing itemized checks, and sometimes accepting payment. Servers may perform additional duties, which may include escorting guests to tables, serving customers seated at counters, setting up and clearing tables, and operating a computer based system for making orders and processing payment.

Servers (also known as wait staff) must be professional, polite, and reliable. They must speak great English to be able to understand and converse with the customers and they must be able to learn and describe food proficiently. Wait Staff also need to be familiar with the menu, with how the food is prepared, what it tastes like and if special requests are allowed. They need to be informed about specials and special events.

Historically, Servers that provide great customer service can make up to \$150-200 in tips on average per shift, HOWEVER it is up to the guests' discretion and business in the restaurant. Servers must tip 3% of their sales to Bussers/ Hosts. Managers will provide guidelines to staff,.

Job Description: Language Level required for this position: Good.

A busser's job duties include clearing tables, taking dirty dishes to the dishwasher, setting empty tables and otherwise assisting the waiting staff. Responsibilities may also include bringing water and introductory foods (tortilla chips, bread etc.) to the table when guests first sit down. Primarily, a busser does all assistant activities including taking out the trash, shining cutlery, refilling water pitchers and restocking dinnerware and utensils. Bussers may also be required to clean restrooms. This will involve cleaning toilets and using cleaning chemicals. Comfortable, rubber soled black shoes are required.

Participants will be using cleaning chemicals. Participants will be handling pork products.

Historically, Bussers on average make up to \$50-\$100 in tips on average per shift. These tips are distributed at least every week. The bussers will receive 3% of the servers' tips. As a restaurant host or hostess, participants will be greeting guests arriving at the restaurant, welcoming and seating them.

The responsibilities of the host include monitoring the open dining sections of the restaurant for empty and cleaned tables, estimating wait times for guests, monitoring the guest waiting list, and ensuring that the needs of the guests are met while they are waiting. The host is often responsible for answering the telephone, booking reservations and moving tables together to accommodate large parties.

A dishwasher's primary duties include scraping, racking and stacking glassware/plate ware/silverware properly in the dishwasher and washing pots, dishes, etc. by using hand or dish equipment.

Dishwashers then restock all ware when clean. Additional duties include removing garbage and recyclable materials from the kitchen area to appropriate receptacles as well as sweeping and mopping.

Dishwashers are responsible for maintaining a clean workstation, assisting kitchen staff when required and assisting in overall kitchen cleanliness. Dishwashers will come into contact with cleaning chemicals, and wear rubber gloves. Wash dishes in a fast and efficient manner.

Prep and maintain dessert bar product and cleanliness.

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Brief description of housing:

The employer will make housing assignments prior to participants' arrival. The employer has reserved these housing options for participants with local landlords. Participants' housing agreements will be with their landlords, not the employer.

The housing options typically consist of 2-to-4-bedroom houses or apartment/condo units. All housing options, participants will have their own beds, either individual single beds or bunk beds. Participants whose employment is terminated (involuntarily or voluntarily) have 2 weeks from the last day of work to find a new job and to submit a valid and complete Self-Arranged Job Offer (SAJO) to Greenheart Exchange for consideration. If the participant fails to submit a SAJO within the two-week deadline, Greenheart Exchange will shorten the participant's program.

If Greenheart Exchange rejects the SAJO, the participant has one (1) business day to resubmit a new or a revised SAJO, based on the directions received from Greenheart Exchange. If the participant no longer has housing, the participant must look for permanent housing immediately, and within two weeks must secure permanent housing that complies with Greenheart Exchange's Housing Guidelines.
