Full Job Description for Lifeguards:

Lifeguards must constantly monitor guests in pools and ensure that guests follow the park rules. Lifeguards will be next to or in chlorinated water and will be standing, sitting, and walking for long periods of time. As a lifeguard, participants must ensure a safe and healthy environment for the swimmers and they must be able to recognize and react properly in emergency situations. Additional duties may include cleaning the pool and surrounding area-deck, guard office, removing trash and enforcing facility rules and gate control. Participants may be cleaning toilets and be using cleaning chemicals.

Lifeguard Wage details:

During the time they are enrolled in the StarGuard ELITE course, participants will be paid \$7.25/per hour.
